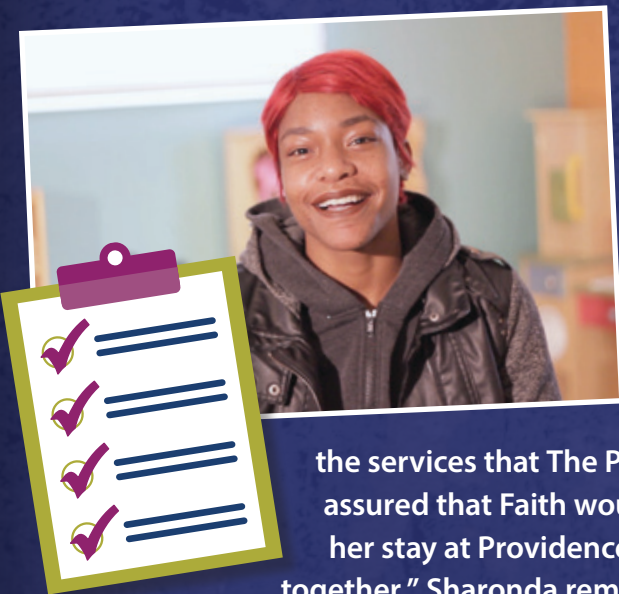
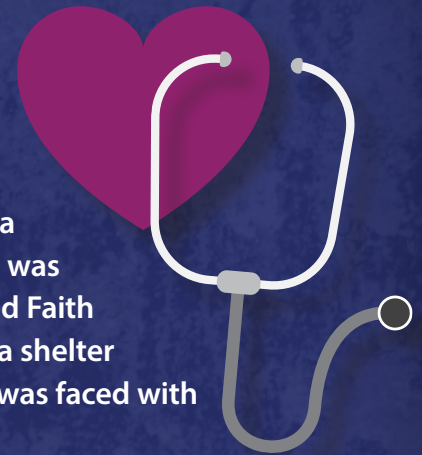




THE HEART OF THE MATTER: SHARONDA & FAITH

Early in Sharonda's pregnancy, she found out her daughter had a life-threatening heart condition and would require multiple heart surgeries. Sharonda strongly believed her daughter would survive, and when she was born, she named her **Faith**.

Faith's heart condition and fragile health was not the only obstacle Sharonda was facing. She was experiencing domestic violence and her living situation was not safe for her or Faith. Without dependable friends or family, Sharonda and Faith were faced with the prospect of going to a shelter, but Sharonda knew that a shelter would not be a safe environment for her daughter. As a loving mother, she was faced with the unimaginable: nowhere to turn, no one to help, nowhere to go.



Sadly, Sharonda is far from alone in her struggles. In the past 3 years, we've seen a 70% increase in admissions. Last year, 36% of our families were homeless or had unsafe housing, and an additional 14% of children served were a victim of or witness to violence.

Sharonda was referred to the services of Providence House by the Cuyahoga County Division of Children and Family Services and she was admittedly hesitant: "I was skeptical to bring her here because of her heart condition. I was afraid of anyone else taking care of her besides me." With

the services that The Prentiss Wellness Nursery provides on site, Sharonda could be assured that Faith would receive the care and medical attention she required during her stay at Providence House. "I knew that she would be safe while I got myself together," Sharonda remembers. "I knew I didn't have to worry about her. The staff knew everything about her heart condition, what she needed to eat, and what to do in an emergency."

Even with reassurance, bringing a child to Providence House can be a very difficult decision for any parent. "I remember they showed me around, showed me that her bed was comfortable, that she was safe, that she was taken care of. It was such a relief," Sharonda says tearfully.

Faith has been at Providence House for 6 weeks, and Sharonda is actively participating in all of the programs that are offered, and now has a job. "I am currently looking for housing. I miss her, but she loves it here," Sharonda says. "Providence House is like my family. I can talk to them, I trust them. I would not be able to do anything I need to do or change my situation without them."

Updates on progress and next steps in our Vision 40 Strategic Plan will celebrate the continued growth and innovation at Providence House and our path to the future.

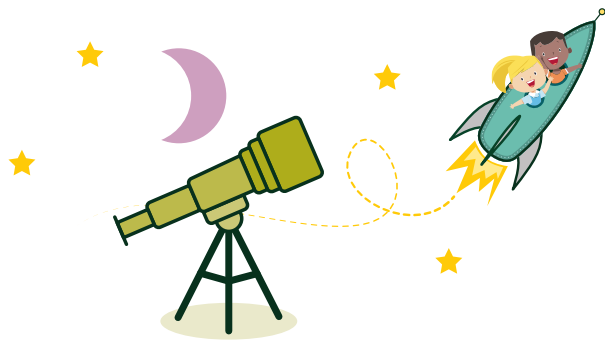
I hope that you will join us on April 21st to meet our families, learn more about community issues affecting our children, and support our continued efforts to keep children safe and families together.

Providence House: Responding to Our Community's Most Pressing Needs

Since the late seventies, crisis nursery services have been provided for parents seeking wellness, stability, and safety for their families, but many fear losing their children to foster care if they ask for help to reach their goals. Our outcomes show that the Providence House Crisis Nursery model can strengthen families and prevent children from entering foster care.

We want to share with you how our services are helping some of our community's most vulnerable families impacted by the opioid epidemic and Ohio's high infant mortality rate.

Opioid Epidemic

Providence House has been caring for children of parents struggling with substance abuse since its founding in 1981.

- Ohio ranks second in the country for number of overdoses related to heroin.
- At least half of children taken into custody last year in Ohio had parents struggling with substance abuse.

In the past five years:

- We have cared for 59 children whose parents were struggling with substance abuse, including alcohol, opioids, and other drugs.
- 85% of these children were reunified with their parent or guardian with 78% parent compliance with recommended Providence House family preservation services.

Infant Mortality

Providence House is committed to improving birth outcomes in Ohio and has joined the Cuyahoga County First Year Infant Mortality Initiative and Ohio Equity Institute to Improve Birth Outcomes to reduce infant mortality rates in our community and throughout Ohio.

- Ohio's infant mortality rate is 7.2 per 1,000 live births and ranks 45th nationally.

In the past five years:

- We have cared for 155 high-risk infants under 12 months old who were born premature, narcotic weaned, or diagnosed Failure to Thrive.
- 93% of these children were reunified with their parent or guardian with 79% parent compliance with recommended Providence House family preservation services.
